General Information	
Brief Introduction of the University	The University of Tokyo, also known as "Todai" was established in 1877 as the first national university in Japan. As a leading research university, Todai offers courses in essentially all academic disciplines at both undergraduate and graduate levels and conducts research across the full spectrum of academic activity. The university aims to provide its students with a rich and varied academic environment that ensures opportunities for both intellectual development and the acquisition of professional knowledge and skills.

	The University of Tokyo (UTokyo) accepts exchange students from partner universities with which the University has entered into a Memorandum of Understanding concerning student exchange. Exchange students are allowed to choose between the TYPE G or TYPE U program depending on their purpose of participation and/or their proficiency in the English and/or Japanese language.
University–wide Student Exchange Program	The TYPE G program allows exchange students to take the regular courses where the lectures are predominantly in Japanese. For students to participate in the TYPE G program, adequate level of proficiency in Japanese is required. Graduate level exchange students will be able to conduct research under the guidance of faculty members in the University's Graduate Schools. The TYPE U program offers opportunity for overseas undergraduate students to take various courses at UTokyo
	given in English and/or Japanese in the various Faculties in accordance with their English and/or Japanese language proficiency.

	 1.Undergraduate students enrolled for the entire period of the program at a partner university that has concluded a university-wide memorandum for student exchange with UTokyo. 2.Undergraduate students who will return to their home university after completing their study or research at UTokyo. 3.Undergraduate students demonstrating excellent academic performance. 4.Undergraduate students having a clear intention to study at UTokyo.
	5.Undergraduate students having the required language proficiency and meeting other conditions.
	Note 1: The TYPE U program is designed for undergraduate students but graduate students will be considered on a case-by-case basis. However, to be eligible to apply to the TYPE U program you must be enrolled as an undergraduate student at the time of application.
	Note 2: In principle first and second year undergraduate students are not accepted at the University of Tokyo due to the internal structure of the university.

Program is designed to be completed by students for one year. Students who complete the program will be issued with a 'certificate of completion'.

The International Exchange Group of International Affairs Department at the University of Tokyo will contact the students with details of the procedure after their applications to study or research at the University of Tokyo have been approved. Entry to Japan (eligibility to reside in Japan)	Exchange students must have a valid passport during their stay in Japan. There are several protocols to which the students need to adhere, including that in principle all students will require a visa providing the status of "College Student" to study at a Japanese university. After their applications to study or research at the University of Tokyo have been approved, the host faculty or graduate school will provide information about the process of obtaining a Certificate of Eligibility. The students will then need to take the Certificate of Eligibility and other required documents to the nearest Japanese Embassy or Consulate to obtain a College Student visa.		
OIt is the exchange students' own responsibility to be insured for the entire period of their studies before leaving their home countries. ONational Health Insurance Program Exchange students who plan to stay in Japan for more than three months will need to join the Nar Insurance Program. OPersonal Accident Insurance for Students Pursuing Education and Research "Gakkensai" and the optional "Futai Gakuso" "Gakkensai" provides necessary support in the case of accident or injury suffered in the course of activities related to research or education. Exchange students do not need to apply for this insurance as UTokyo enrolls all its students and pays all premiums. "Futai Gakuso" is an optional extra to the "Gakkensai" that can be obtained for a cost (JPY 7,700 for six months). It complements a scope of insurance liability in your life such as compensation responsibility. We strongly recommend those who ride a bicycle in Japan to obtain "Futai Gakuso".
